





Yafinceio “Big B” Harris

We talked with Yafinceio, better known as “Big B”, from Peace During War and got a chance to ask him some questions. He said 2012 his goal has been to be a better father and to understand what it’s like to break a generational curse. His grandfather was a killer, his daddy was a killer. So he wanted to make changes when he got out of the prison. In 10 years he sees himself outside in the outreach field on the most solid foundation to continue his dreams. He said opening his own business he was scared all his life. He was rejected for being thugish, being a big guy, having gold in his mouth. He was looked at as “not fit for the job”. 2023 was his first time to write a grant. He took the steps because he felt it was time and knows he has a big heart. He said the youth should start investing in themselves.





ShoeMigos is a new shoe store located at 615 W. Kalamazoo Ave. The hours for the shoe store are 1pm-8pm Tuesday-Saturday. Sunday and Monday is by appointment only. They also offer barber services. The barbers come in 9am-8pm on the days that they are open. The haircuts are \$30 for adults, \$40 if you have a beard, and \$20 for kids cuts.

ShoeMigos carry a lot of exclusive brands of shoes like Jordan, Yeezy, Nike, Adidas and New Balance. They were inspired because they have a passion for shoes in high school. They use to talk about opening and owning a shoe store, and now they have one. They started in Parchment and had a shop for about a year and a half. They have only been at the new Kalamazoo location for about 2-3 weeks.



In 10 years, they want to have some more stores in more states. They want to take it across country and try for opening a location in Texas. The love they have for their business doesn't have them wanting to do anything else. They said the only changes they would make is more locations.
